We are profoundly lucky to live in a town where we have the transparency to ask our residents their opinions on town spending and that they take the time to respond.

Speaking of budget, Town Council recently approved a work order to repair potholes and seal the cracks on our roads this month. This critical annual maintenance helps extend the life of our roads. We are also in the process of planning a reconstruction of Dove Creek Road from Gibbons to Noble Champions as well as an asphalt overlay of Rockgate Road. Both of these projects will be completed by Fall 2018.
